

Premier turns sod to kick start Stage 4 works

NSW Premier Gladys Berejiklian and Member for Dubbo Troy Grant were at Dubbo Hospital on Monday 2 July to turn the first sod for a new clinical building, which is the final stage of the \$150 million Dubbo Hospital Redevelopment Stages 3 and 4.

When Stage 4 construction is completed, the community will receive a hospital building that includes:

- A new emergency department and short stay unit
- A new medical imaging unit
- A new critical care floor comprising of:
 - ⇒ Coronary care/stroke unit
 - ⇒ Intensive care unit
 - ⇒ Cardiac catheter laboratory
- A new ambulatory care unit; and
- A new main entry, drop off zone and car parking

A new and expanded renal unit above the existing Extended Day Surgery Unit will also be delivered as part of Stage 4.

Stage 4 construction will be carefully staged to minimise disruption to patients and staff.

The sod turn for Stage 4 construction was followed by the unveiling of schematic design for the \$35 million Western Cancer Centre Dubbo. This project is jointly funded, with the NSW Government contributing \$10 million and the Federal Government providing \$25 million.

The Cancer Centre will be constructed in parallel with Stage 4 works and will provide 16 chemotherapy chairs, a bunker for radiation therapy and PET CT Scanner for cancer diagnostic services. To view the fly-through [click here.](#), or type
