



Staff will soon enjoy open and bright workstations and offices when they move in to the Ian Locke building.

The NSW Government has committed \$150 million to deliver Stages 3 and 4 of the Dubbo Hospital Redevelopment which includes a new In-patient Unit, Emergency Department, Imaging Unit, Critical Care floor, Renal Unit (originally part of Stages 1 and 2 works), Ambulatory Care Unit and upgrades to oncology services (currently being reviewed as part of the services plan for the Integrated Cancer Centre Dubbo Project) and Women and Children's Community Health. There will also be a new Ambulance bay, main entry and drop off zone and additional car parking.
